Respect Your Volunteers

As we are starting into the new show year I would like to familiarize our new members, and remind our returning members, how AMA functions. This organization is run by volunteers exclusively, without them we have no association! So with that said, please respect them and the position that they hold. The officers and board members are there because they want to be, not because they are getting paid. The same with the committee chair's and members, many are not board members, just willing to volunteer to keep AMA going.

So just a few things that seem like common sense but may get over looked.

Know your rules. The most common part of our rule book that seems to get questioned, in my opinion, is the points. Please, if you have a question about the points go refresh yourself with them before you call the points chairman. Most the time, I think, you'll answer your own question. If you do need to call, be courteous, and don't get mad or demanding (Remember, more flies are gotten with honey than vinegar!). There are many factors, other than human nature, that can contribute to the points being incorrect. Unless you've done that job, you have no idea how many balls the points keeper has in the air, trying to get things done in a timely matter with the correct information. I won't get into the time commitment!

When registering an animal, please read all the instructions in order to make the registration chairman's job as easy as possible. They tend to come in all at once so it may take some time to process new registrations.

Be appreciative of the media team that puts together our website and gets the information out on Facebook and other social media sights. They can only report the information given to them.

Whether renewing your membership or joining for the first time, please provide all the information asked for on the form. You would be surprised how many forms have minimal information. In renewing if you don't provide your current membership number, you may get a new number, replacing your past one. Don't expect them to look up information you weren't willing to hunt down. If doing snail mail, send more than a check in an envelope! Even if you don't have an official membership form, at least write your information on a piece of paper. Unfortunately, most of us still can't read minds.

Another thing to remember, in this world of texts and emails, be careful how you write them. If you are using caps in any or all of your messages the recipient will more than likely assume they are being scolded or yelled at since they don't know your mood or intent. Expect a curt answer if you send what appears to be a curt message.

These are just a few of the jobs that our volunteers fill, and situations they run up against, so just remember to be respectful and put yourself in their shoes, hopefully one day it is you leading the committee and you'll appreciate the same consideration!

AMA Isn't Just About Showing!

If showing isn't your thing or you and your mule want a break you might want to try some of the other programs we offer. Check out the descriptions here, and in our rule book, to better acquaint yourself with fun ways to spend time with your mule and friends.

LEVA: Long Ears Versatility Award. This program supports any activity you compete in with your mule or donkey that is not an AMA approved event. This includes open shows, trail trials, dressage competitions, ranch versatility, driving competitions or any equine competition. Riders/drivers must be an AMA member and their mule/donkey must be registered with the AMA. Information is provided by the member and submitted to the AMA for each month that they are involved in a competition. Awards are presented for this program at the yearly AMA Awards Banquet. Forms are available on the AMA website.

SSA: Time spent in the saddle for any reason other than competition and logging your hours can earn a Saddle Sore Award. This includes trail rides or schooling in an arena, just about any time you ride except when just using your long ear for a chair! Participants must be AMA members with a mule/donkey registered with the AMA. Hours are logged and submitted by the member on the honor system. This is a great program with wonderful awards that is overlooked each year. Refer to the AMA website for forms and information.
