In Loving Memory of Ann "Mouse" Lange

The AMA lost one of its long ear members, Ann "Mouse" Lange on December 31, 2020. She passed at the age of 79 and was best known for her work with the National Forest Service, riding trails in the backcountry, and mapping and rating the terrain for over 20 years. She did this to ensure that the trails can remain open for all stock users. She rode all of these trails with a group of like minded individuals to ensure the accuracy of these trails for her fellow riders and safety of the animals. Ann volunteered her time to ride these trails herself to give a personal view of the unique needs required to maintain these trails.

In the 2011 Bishop Mule Days program magazine, Ann was recognized as the Best Friend of the Packers, which is voted on by Packers themselves. In addition to this recognition, Ann also was a National Wilderness Chairperson, and a lifetime member of the Back Country Horsemen Association. Ann was a pivotal member of the Packing community and will be greatly missed by many.
